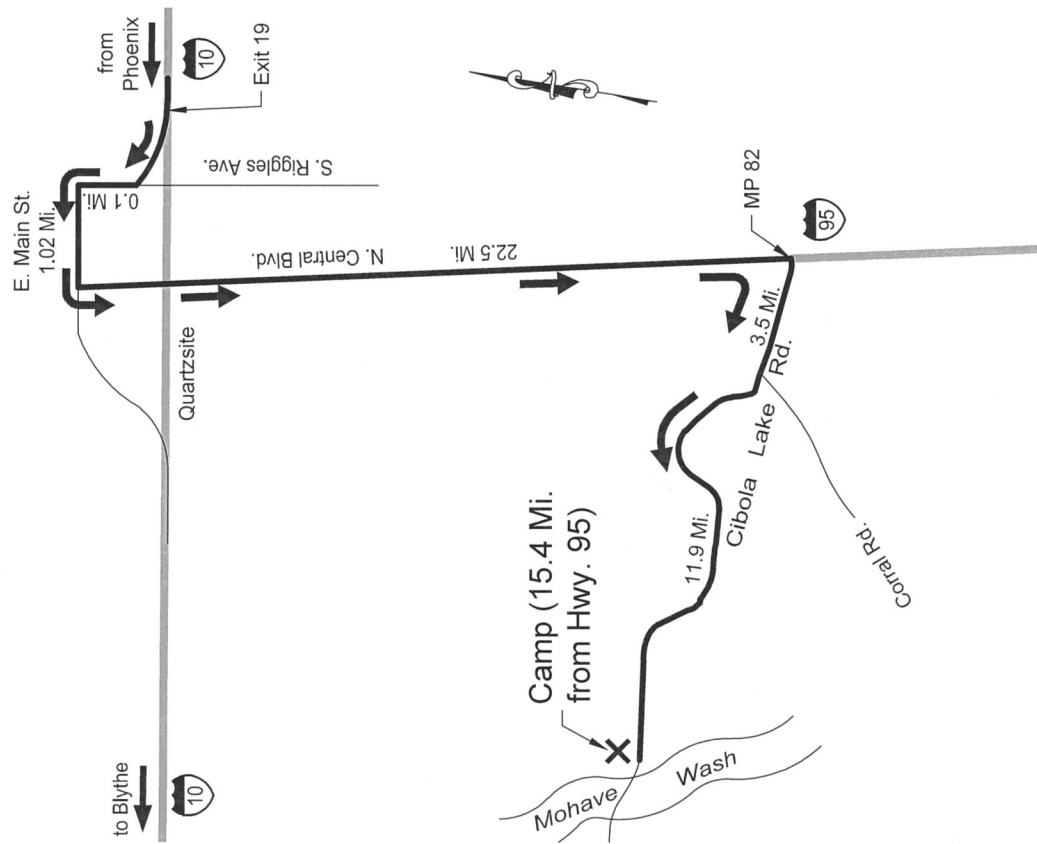

ADBSS/AGFD COOPERATIVE WATER PROJECT

Jane Hunts Mohave Tinaja Project

February 10-12, 2012

Location:

GMU 43B: South Trigo Mountains, Yuma Proving Ground
Approximate GPS coordinates of camp site: N 33°24.290'; W 114° 25.828'

Project Description:

FROM PHOENIX: Head west on I-10 to Exit 19 at Quartzite and exit right. Turn RIGHT and head northbound 0.1 miles to the intersection with E. Main Street. Turn LEFT and head westbound 1.0 miles to the intersection with N. Central Boulevard (Highway 95). Turn LEFT and head southbound 22.5 miles to the intersection with the Cibola Lake Road at milepost 82. Turn RIGHT and head westbound 15.4 miles on the Cibola Lake Road to camp on the north side.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The AZGFD development crew is scheduled to begin preparation work on Friday, February 10th. Volunteer assistance will be needed on Saturday to remove sand, silt, gravel and debris from this existing tinaja. If the tinaja can be cleaned to the bottom, volunteer assistance may be requested to aid in sealing the tinaja on Sunday morning.

Difficulty of Hike:

Please call the AGFD (toll free) at 866-950-2433 for additional information pertaining to minors and any associated restrictions relative to this project.

Relatively easy with a steep final approach to the Tinaja

Special Advisories:

- 1) Please bring charcoal, firewood, or propane stoves for cooking/heating. Wood is a rare in the desert and best left alone to provide nutrients to surrounding plants and habitat to numerous small animals.
- 2) Road to campsite is accessible by two wheel drive vehicles, motor homes, and trucks pulling trailers.
- 3) Please bring your own water and plenty of it.
- 4) This project is being accomplished in cooperation with the Arizona Game and Fish Department and the US Army.
- 5) Funded by the bighorn sheep Special Tag Fund and the Arizona Game and Fish Department.
- 6) Please follow the map and do not drive off existing roadways.
- 7) Please do not destroy native vegetation.
- 8) Campsites should not be located more than 50 feet from existing two track roads in and around the camp area. Fire rings and vehicle tracks leading to camps should be raked out when leaving the project.

General Advisories:

GENERAL ADVISORIES: This is a very remote desert area and the possibilities of danger and life threatening injuries exist. Volunteers should have a reliable vehicle, be in good physical condition and comfortable hiking in rugged desert terrain. Volunteers should bring and wear protective clothing, a sack lunch, rain gear, sunscreen, and water (enough for the whole day) to the project site. Project site is unsafe for young children due to the steep terrain and the use of construction equipment. Parents or guardians must maintain direct control and supervision of any minors on the project site at all times. Pets are discouraged. Projects will take place regardless of local weather conditions. All ADBSS projects feature a catered Saturday evening meal and Sunday breakfast. Membership in the ADBSS will put you on the mailing list to receive project flyers and maps.
