













Santa Catalina Bighorn Sheep Reintroduction Project

April 23 through May 6, 2015

BRIEFING

The following is a summary of bighorn sheep reintroduction activities on the Coronado National Forest from April 23 – May 6, 2015.

LAMBS

Lambs continue to be observed among groups of ewes and younger rams.

MORTALITIES

There were no known mortalities of collared sheep during this reporting period. The last known mortality was on December 23, 2014.

CURRENT POPULATION STATUS

As of May 6, 2015, 40 collared sheep are known to be alive.

RESEARCH FIELD NOTES

There are no research updates.

NATIONWIDE COVERAGE

Jack Hanna was involved in our sheep capture and release last year. His "Into the Wild" segment on the Catalina bighorn sheep project is scheduled to air the week of May 11. According to his website, the show will air on these local stations:
